# Minutes of the Foothills Model T Ford Club Meeting February 24th, 2016 at the Aerospace Museum

# What an Adventure

Many of you know Fred and Teri Holt who are members of our club from Medicine Hat. In the Summer of 2014 they were kind enough to host a BBQ for a group of our members who were on a Model T Camping Tour in Cypress Hills. At that event we were introduced to a young man named Roy Gale. Roy and Fred had just recently built a 1926 T Touring car out of spare parts at Fred and Teri's Dusty Wheels Garage.



The car is Roy's pride and joy and at that time he had just finished driving the car in the Medicine Hat Stampede Parade.

Well, one thing lead to another and Roy decided he wanted to drive the car to Edmonton to visit his family for his milestone birthday in June of 2015. So the planning began. A route that avoided fast moving traffic was selected. Fred and Teri provided a trouble truck and a spare T Tudor, just in case. Clayton Holt also volunteered to participate. Three days were allotted to make the trip.

Day one, June 21, 2015, Father's Day, 8:15 am Roy pulls out of the yard with Fred as his passenger. Teri and Clayton follow in the trouble truck. The plan is to reach Hanna by evening.

The first big test was the Redcliff hill, which the T pulled at a steady 23 km/hr. There was some concern about driving the first 50 K on Hwy 1 but

the car performed admirably and the drivers of modern vehicles were happy to cheer Roy and his T on their way.

About 180 Km into the journey at 12:46 pm near Cessford the sky opened and the rain poured down. It was time for lunch and a tough decision. The Tudor was unloaded and the band of vagabonds enjoyed a picnic in the trailer

protected from the rain. Roy decided that rather than wait for the rain to stop he would continue on driving the Tudor.

It wasn't long before they encountered road construction, a new gravel road without the gravel. It was a slippery mess. The Tudor fared quite well but the trouble truck could barley make headway pulling the trailer with all four wheels spinning.

Roy's left leg finally got tired of holding the pedal in low gear so they waited for the trouble truck to catch up and give them a tow to the pavement and a reprieve from the mud. 
June 22, 2015 Roy Gale turned 95, that's right Roy is 6 years older than his Model T.



## Here is a fun "apocryphal" story from Ross

The four Katz brothers, Lowell, Norman, Hiram, and Max, invented the first automobile air-conditioner. On August 15, 1941, the temperature in Detroit was 92 degrees. The four brothers walked into Henry Ford's office and convinced him to come out to the parking lot to their car. They got him to get into the car, which was about 120 degrees, turned on the air conditioner, and cooled the car off within a few minutes. Henry got very excited and invited them back to the office, where he offered them \$2 million for the patent. The brothers refused, saying they would settle for \$1 million, but they wanted the recognition by having a label, 'The Katz Air-Conditioner on the dashboard of each Ford car in which it was installed. Now Henry Ford was more than just a little anti-Semitic, and there was no way he was going to put the katz's name on two million Fords. They haggled back and forth for about two hours and finally agreed on \$3 million and that just their first names would be shown. And so to this day, all Ford air conditioners show - Low, Norm, Hi, and Max - on the controls.
