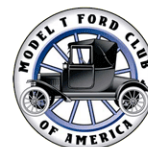

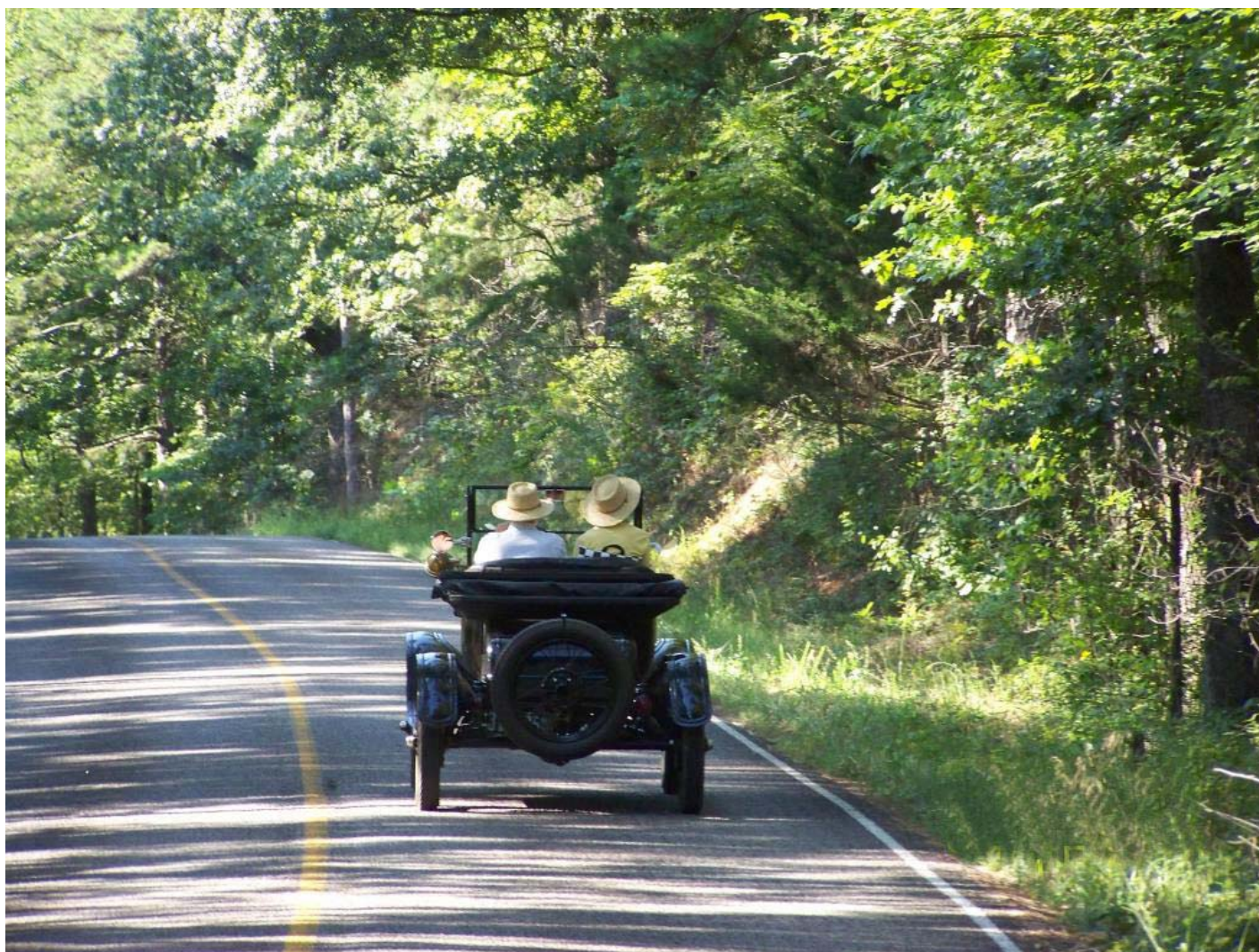
President's Message
