Garage Tour April 12 2014

The garage tour started at the High River Agricultural Museum with 15 members attending. Allen Millard gave US an introduction of how the idea of the tractor museum became reality. They are planning an extension starting this summer. donated artifacts are added all the time. We viewed the unique collection of Model-Ts, tractors and related items from the early 1900 to 1960.

We then visited Dave Snider's to see his collection and workshop. A completely restored Depot Hack and Model T pickup used many years on his farm before restoration, as well as a Model-A rescued from the flood waters in High River in 2013 and fully restored.

After lunch at the Burger Baron in Okotoks we went to Karl Johnson's to inspect his yard with numerous parts and projects waiting to be started. During the warm-up in his shop Karl told us about the interesting history of this area and the ghost town Norma before CP moved the station to Aldersyde.

Our last visit of the day was to Allen Millard's shop. Allen is dividing his time between the Tractor Museum and restoring a unique tractor/forklift combination custom-built by a Calgary company in the 1940's. He also showed us his collection of antique tractors and other projects awaiting his attention.

We thank our hosts Allen Millard, Jim Fraser, Dave Snider and Karl Johnson for their hospitality and efforts to make this a very interesting day.

Matthews, Lorne Edward April 19, 1946 - Melville, SK - April 16, 2014 - High River, AB

It is with heavy hearts we must announce the passing on a very unique individual after a long and brave battle with cancer. Lorne Edward Matthews of High River, passed away at High River Hospital on Wednesday, April 16, 2014 at the age of 67 years. His loving wife Beverly, daughter Mykaela and life-long friend Al Dakin were by his side. Lorne was born on April 19, 1946 in Melville, SK to Wilson and Alma Matthews. Lorne attended the University of Manitoba where he studied architecture. He married his wife Beverly in 1969, and with her and his three-month old daughter Mykaela, moved to Jamaica where he worked for three years. While there, they had another daughter Rebecca. They then moved to Malaysia for a year and London, England for six months. Avid travelers, Lorne, Beverley and Mykaela (until she was 16) visited over thirty countries. The family moved to Yellowknife, NT after returning to Canada where Lorne worked for the Territorial and Federal governments for twentyseven years. While in Yellowknife, they hosted fifteen foreign exchange students from all over the world, most of whom they kept in touch with. After retiring in 2001, they moved to High River where they became active members of the community and made many good friends. Lorne was a member of the Liars Club, which met every Thursday at the Auction Mart, River City Classics, the Calgary Model T Club, the Tractor Museum and the High Oddfellows. Never boring, always opinionated, he was a renaissance man who loved trying new languages, food and travel. If he did anything, he did it with everything he had. He was a man, who once he gave his word to a friend, would always follow through. Lorne is survived by his wife Beverley, daughter Mykaela Haarstad (Blair); grandson Liam Matthews-Nesland: granddaughters and Meagan, Alison and Morgan Haarstad.

He will be missed by his friend Jack Turner for their evening coffee at McDonalds. He was predeceased by his parents, Wilson and Alma, brother Larry, daughter Rebecca and granddaughter Annastasia. A Celebration of Lorne's Life will be held at a later date. Forward condolences through
