VTAA Spring 2021 Tour Report by Chris Bamford

Club members have seen the Vintage Touring Association of Alberta promoted numerous times over the past year in *Footnotes* (thanks, Ross!) and there is an actual event to read about. The VTAA was formed in 2019 by Mike Reid, Bob Callfas and your reporter to promote our first love: driving and touring in pre-'32 vehicles. We three have organized several "Oldies" tours with the Edmonton Antique Car Club in years past; despite our best efforts with shorter distances and slower roads, and encouraging members to bring out the old iron, early cars were *always* a small minority. The EACC frowned on deeming events exclusive to any particular era vehicle, so a new club seemed the way to go.

We put together a slate of three tours for 2020 just before Covid hit — those tour plans were updated for 2021 and our inaugural event, the Spring Hub Tour, was held in Sundre on June 25-27. Here are a few highlights from the weekend...



The Long Haulers: Three cars convoyed down from Edmonton on Friday, and the same three convoyed back successfully on Sunday (apparently a lot of the Calgary folks *trailered* their cars to the event!) Your reporter and Lady Michelle were in the trouble-free '26 T Touring; both Model As (Ryan Fenrich, Steve & Jessie Bemount,) had some minor issues but no tow trucks were required. Our door-to-door distance in the '26 was 537 miles, at an average 35 mph with fuel consumption of 20.6 mpg. The Touring has a 1938 aftermarket radiator with diminished cooling capacity; with the hood removed there was no boil-over despite the heat.







Friday Meet & Greet: Indoor gatherings were still restricted in June, so our Friday Pizza Party was held behind and beside the Mountain View Inn. This group is enjoying some sun and socializing; more were around the corner in the shade. We were delighted see so many new faces and new old cars, with lots of folks from the Calgary and Red Deer areas plus a half dozen from Edmonton and a handful from

around Medicine Hat and Lethbridge.

The Parking Lot:

The Friday shakedown cruise was 30 miles out and back to the Cartier Creek PRA along the Red Deer River. That's Fred and Teri Holt's big '21 Studebaker on the left. Click HERE for the video of most of the 24 vintage rides leaving for Sundre.

The Gravel: The Saturday tour was a 91-mile loop up to Caroline and back through Bearberry. There were about three miles of this stuff early on with a paved alternative for the gravel-averse; very few drivers opted for the escape route.



The Competition: Following a nice lunch and impromptu car show at Barron's Restaurant in Caroline, we puttered down to the local "Wheels of Time" museum for car games and a museum visit. Competitors each donned a soon-to-be-obsolete covid mask as a blindfold, then did their best to drive to a predetermined target 92' away. Each driver got a spotter (Ryan

Fenrich does the honours here for Chris Brancaccio) to keep them on the straight and narrow. Chris B stopped a mere 29' off the mark, which was actually better than most. Our first and currently-undefeated champion is Don Bugbee of Red Deer, who piloted their '29 Chev 1-1/2 ton to within 6'-6" of the orange frisbee. Calgarian Gary Callendar drove his Model A to 6'-8" from the target, and Fred Holt came in third at 7'-0". Your reporter, who despite having done this exercise a few times, was off by 60'. The Caroline Museum was a friendly and welcoming respite from the hot sun and made for a great 'alternate activity'.







The Chauffeur: Most participants drove Model Ts (10) and As (9) but there were some lesser seen rigs as well, including Pat McKenna's '15 Studebaker touring (Pat in the back, Ray Fowler shotgun, Ryan Fenrich at the wheel), '24 Oakland (Jim & Faye Grose, ex-Emil Hermary), 1930 Hudson (Harvey & Kathy Callfas), and 1911 Cadillac 30

(Mike & Mary Reid, ex-Orest Kitzel).

The club was recently contacted to assist a publisher in the Czech Republic by providing information on a paper model of a Model T





They wrote "Hello, friends, we are fans of paper models from Europe (Czech Republic). Paper models have a long tradition in our country and are very popular here, after all, they are also well known in the USA ...

We are currently preparing a re-edition of a paper model of the Ford T car, authored by architect Richard Vyškovský. We would like to specify the year and production type of the Ford T, according to which the paper model was created.

We would therefore like to contact you for assistance in identifying the type that was the model. According to our amateur research, it is most likely a Ford T Torpedo Runabout from 1911, or 1912. However, it is possible that the paper model does not faithfully represent any particular type and is a kind of derivative of several types. In that case, we are looking for the type that the model most closely resembles.

The Ford T car model is constructed in a 1:32 scale, the model range is 2 A4 sheets plus instruction text and a picture. The publication will also contain information about the model, and here we would like to state the most accurate name of the car.

It is possible that our publication could attract your members, fans or customers. We will be happy to answer any questions you may have.
