

Random Tech Tips with Robb Wolff

Grease



It probably does not matter what kind of grease you use to lube your Model T. Pretty much every grease you purchase at Princess Auto, Canadian Tire or the auto parts store will be rated GC-LB NLGI #2. "GC" means that it is certified for wheel bearings and "LB" is certified for chassis lubrication. The #2 denotes thickness (from 0 to 6) according to a rating system established by the National Lubricating Grease Institute (NLGI). There are many types of thickeners used in automotive grease: Aluminum, Calcium, Lithium etc. Not all thickeners are compatible with each other, so it is a good idea to pick one brand and type of grease and stick to it.





Some greases are better at handling high temperatures. If you are running rear disc brakes, look for a grease with a high "drop point" temperature. Finally, many rear main bearings leak and wash out the U-joint grease so for that application use the thickest, cheapest grease you can find.

A "Shop Built" 5¢ Dust Mask

In the past I have used cheap white face masks to filter dust from the air I breathe but I can never get them to seal properly. Here is my home-built solution to the problem using blue paper shop towels.


